HARD-FOUGHT WIN AT RIX'S CREEK

After seven weeks on the picket line, Rix's Creek miners have won a breakthrough agreement that delivers every claim they set out to achieve, including a 17 percent pay rise and major improvements to accident pay.

Backed strongly by the local community, it was the longest mining strike in the Hunter in 25 years and a powerful demonstration of what a united and organised MEU workforce can achieve when they stand together!

PUBLIC HOLIDAY WIN

The MEU has secured a decisive court win that puts employers on notice that they cannot force workers to give up their public holidays. Our case exposed BHP's labour hire operator for forcing workers to work on Christmas and Boxing Day by pulling their names from a hat, and the Federal Court agreed that workers must be asked, not told, to work a public holiday.

It is a big step forward for every worker in the country and a clear reminder that when employers overreach, the MEU is ready to take them on and win.

NZEA UPDATE

The NZEA has applied to the Fair Work Commission for the first Community of Interest determination for power station workers at Torrens Island B gas-fired power station in Adelaide.

Meanwhile, consultation for a Community of Interest for Yallourn power station has kicked off this week, while a determination regarding Eraring power station is expected before Christmas. A Community of Interest is the first step towards an Energy Industry Jobs Plan which gives workers affected by power station closures support for retraining and redeployment.
